In Appreciation of
Sylvia Moir

WHEREAS, Sylvia Moir began her distinguished law enforcement career in 1988 as a community services officer for the Roseville Police Department until hired by the Sacramento Police Department in 1990 and served as a field training officer, a Detective in the Special Investigations Unit, and as the Department's first Alcoholic Beverage Control grant officer; and

WHEREAS, Sylvia Moir, as a Sergeant worked in Patrol, and served as the Sacramento Police Department Academy Director, and as a Lieutenant in the Metro Unit commanded all special operation groups, and had oversight of Planning and Fiscal functions; and

WHEREAS, Sylvia Moir was selected for a Commander position at the Menlo Park Police Department in 2008 and served as the Commander of Operations; and

WHEREAS, Sylvia Moir was selected as the Chief of Police for El Cerrito Police Department in 2010 guiding her agency with innovative Leadership; and

WHEREAS, Sylvia Moir was appointed by the Governor of the State of California to Commissioner of the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) in December 2012 and was reappointed in June 2014; and

WHEREAS, Sylvia Moir as a long-time facilitator for the POST Sherman Block Supervisory Leadership Institute (SBSLI) and as an academy instructor has positively influenced the lives of hundreds of law enforcement officers and has spent her career mentoring and encouraging women to be leaders, serving as a role model for all ranks and positions; and

WHEREAS, Sylvia Moir holds a Bachelor of Science in Criminal Justice from California State University-Sacramento, a Master of Arts in Organizational Management, and attended the Naval Postgraduate School, Center for Homeland Defense and Security (receiving the Butch Straub Award), is a graduate of the POST SBSLI, and is a graduate of the Los Angeles Police Department West Point Leadership; and

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that Commissioner Sylvia Moir has devoted her career to the professionalism of California law enforcement both through her service as a peace officer, as an educator, and as a Commissioner who provided sage and insightful direction to POST.

It is in this spirit of gratitude and appreciation that the California Commission on POST presents this resolution and remains eternally thankful for all that you have contributed, for all that you have accomplished.
