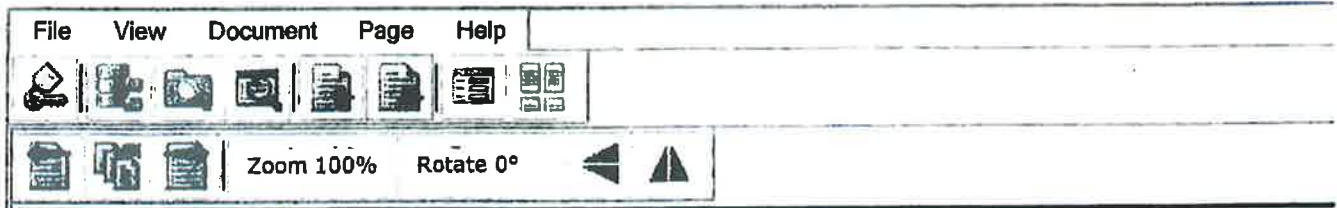

SUBJECT: Exception to Regulation Request for 6 Year Exemption Rule

Mrs. Engler,

As per our telephone conversation, I am providing the following request in hopes of receiving an exemption to the six-year regulation. I just missed the cut-off by a few months to be eligible.

On 23rd day April, 2002 I successfully completed the Basic P.O.S.T. Modular Academy at the Alameda County Sheriff's Office Regional Training Center in Dublin, California while still serving Active duty in the military. Unfortunately, shortly after graduating from the Academy, I was deployed to the Middle East in support of Operation Enduring Freedom. The mission in the Middle East was to provide Peace Keeping duties during constant patrolling. I did not return back to the United States after deployment until March 2006. I have not been given much of a flexibility while serving in the military to complete any probationary period and/or conduct civilian law enforcement training, however I was receiving constant training on patrolling, firearms, and martial arts as I am still receiving serving in the military. After my return to the United States in 2006, I was sent overseas once again annually to Latin America on multiple military humanitarian missions to provide Spanish translation and security for an Engineer Battalion. On October 6th, 2010 just returning back from a Humanitarian mission in Panama I was faced with the untimely death of mother at 62 years of age after battling with the Lupus disease. In January 2011 things began to slow down with the drawdown of troops returning back from IRAQ and Afghanistan. During the draw-down of troops I was then able to concentrate once again on pursuing my childhood dream of law enforcement career especially with only 5 years remaining before I retire from the military.

On January 3-4 2011 I was given permission by my current unit at the 223rd Military Intelligence Battalion (Linguist) to attend a 16 hour POST Certified Warrant Service/High Risk Arrest Course. I have held a Top Secret Clearance with the Army since 2005, graduate of a Fire Academy Fire in Hayward, California 2001, EMT-B (expired). I also have law enforcement experience with the Guam Police Department (9 years), and the El Monte, California Police Explorer Program (2 years). I am now trying to pursue a career with the San Francisco Police Reserves and/or Alameda County Sheriff Reserves until I am eligible for military retirement in 5 years, and I will then apply for full-time employment with any agency that's hiring.

I have read the Regulation stated in the POST Administrative Manual, Section B - 1008 Basic Course Waiver and Requalification Requirement, however I found it extremely close to impossible for me to serve in a California peace officer/Level 1 reserve officer position while serving in the military overseas and then the death of my mother in 2010 extremely hampered my forward progression. If I am provided a waiver to this regulation, I would be extremely appreciative. Thank You very much for your precious time, and favorable consideration.
