## **Penal Code and Commission Regulations**

**Penal Code section 830.1(a)** - Appointment and authority section for specified peace officer positions (to include District Attorney Investigators)

**Commission Regulation 1005(a)(1)** - Specifies training requirement for District Attorney Investigators. Requires the Regular Basic Course.

**Commission Regulation 1005(a)(2)** - Outlines requirement for the completion of the District Attorney Investigator Transition Course in addition to the Regular Basic Course.

**Penal Code section 832.4(b)** - Requires any peace officer appointed under PC 830.1(a) obtain the POST Basic Certificate upon completion of probation but no later than 24 months after appointment.

**Penal Code section 13510.1** - Requires the certificate program and states, in part, "for the purpose of fostering the professionalization, education, and experience necessary to adequately accomplish the general police service duties."

**Commission Regulation 1001 -** Defines general law enforcement duties as: duties which include the investigation of crime, patrol of a geographic area, responding to the full range of requests for police services, and performing any enforcement action on the full range of law violations.

**Commission Regulation 1011** - Outlines Basic Certificate requirements. Specifies the Regular Basic Course is the training standard to receive the General Basic Certificate. Only the General Basic Certificate attainment is required by PC 832.4(b).

**Penal Code section 832.25(a)** - Requires that all welfare fraud investigators who are appointed as peace officers pursuant to PC 830.35(a) after January 1, 2001 attend and complete the SIBC within one year of hire.

**Commission Regulation 1005(a)(3)** – Specifies the training requirement for Specialized Investigators. Requires the Specialized Investigators Basic Course or Regular Basic Course.

**Penal Code section 832.25(b)** - exempts any investigator who possesses a valid basic peace officer certificate awarded by POST or has successfully completed the RBC within three years from the SIBC requirement in subsection (a).
