Implementation of SB 2—The Budget includes **\$22.7 million** General Fund in 2022-23, and **\$20.6 million ongoing**. SB 2 created the Peace Officer Standards Accountability Division within POST to review and conduct investigations into incidents of serious misconduct that may provide grounds for suspension or revocation of a peace officer's certification.

Officer Wellness—The Budget includes **\$5 million one-time General Fund in 2022-23**, to be spent over three years, to support the physical, mental, and emotional health of local law enforcement personnel through sustainable wellness programs, training, and research.
