A RESOLUTION ACCEPTING THE REQUIREMENTS OF SECTION 13510(c) AND 13522, 13510(c) and 13512 OF THE PENAL CODE RELATIVE TO THE RECRUITMENT AND TRAINING STANDARDS OF PUBLIC SAFETY DISPATCHERS.

Section 1: The Governing Body of the Ohlone Community College District Campus Police Department declares that it desires to qualify to receive aid from the State of California under the provision of Section 13522, Chapter 1 of Title 4, Part 4 of the California Penal Code.

Section 2: The Ohlone Community College District Campus Police Department declares that it accepts the requirements of Section 13510(c), Chapter 1, of Title 4, Part 4, or the California Penal Code, and will adhere to the standards for recruitment and training established by the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training (POST) for Public Safety Dispatchers.

Section 3: The Ohlone Community College District Campus Police Department will adhere to the requirements of Section 13512, Chapter 1, that the Commission and its representatives may make such inquiries as deemed appropriate by the Commission to ascertain that the Campus Police Public Safety Dispatcher personnel adhere to standards for selection and training established by the Commission on Peace Officer Standards and Training.
